After that, we turned to the chicory flavor.

From there, Kraft cheese singles were a huge (and can I say MUCH CHEAPER) hit. For a while.

Last week he suddenly realized that they were fake cheese. And so now, I find myself buying dog log from the fridge section of the pet food aisle, buzzing it up in my food processor and then gingerly squashing a table spoon of the smelly stuff around Gip's pills, three times a day. And I have a fair idea that I will need to come up with another plan in about a month.

Does Gipper realize the immense amount of effort going into his welfare? No.

Does he even appreciate it? I'm not sure. For the most part, he is suspicious of those pills.

Do I for one minute regret being his person? Not a bit. I love that dog. And I will keep finding ways to help him take his pills. Because that is what he needs.

It makes me think of God and the many ways he works to bring healing and wholeness in our lives. So often we don't recognize it. We can be as stubborn as Gip. But he just keeps finding new ways to reach us. And he doesn't give up. He won't. He loves us more than I will ever love Gip.

It makes me pause, thankful, at peace.


