





Greetings church family,

It has been feeling an awful lot like summer recently. Summer does not officially start until June 21, even though for many, Memorial Day is the unofficial start of the summer season. This day from its inception was meant to be more than another holiday or day off from work.

Memorial Day originally honored military personnel who died in the Civil War. The holiday now honors those who died in any war while serving with the United States. Memorial Day is not to be confused with Veterans Day – Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving, whereas Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans. These are the numbers of those who have died in the different wars that the United States have been involved in:

Civil War - Approximately 620,000 Americans died. The Union lost almost 365,000 troops and the Confederacy about 260,000. More than half of these deaths were caused by disease.

World War I - 116,516 Americans died, more than half from disease. World War II - 405,399 Americans died.

Korean War - 36,574 Americans died.

Vietnam Conflict - 58,220 Americans died.

Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm - 383 service members died. Operation Iraqi Freedom - 4,411 service members died.

Operation New Dawn - 73 service members died.

Operation Enduring Freedom - 2,346 service members died.

Operation Freedom's Sentinel - 48 service members have died as of May 2018.

Operation Inherent Resolve - 61 service members have died as of May 2018.

Even though this has been celebrated as a civic holiday I believe that there is some value in acknowledging the sacrifice these people gave. Many left their homes and comforts with the full knowledge that they might never return home. These people were willing to put the greater good of others before their own. They were willing to put their lives on the line so that others might live and have freedom. When we consider it from this perspective it reminds me of another person who was willing to sacrifice His life. Jesus was willing to sacrifice it all so that we could live and have freedom. Don't allow this special day to pass without thinking about the sacrifice of men and women who died so that we could be free to congregate, worship, and pray in church this week. Don't allow this special day to pass without recognizing that Jesus sacrificed it all in the battle between good and evil. So that you and I could have eternal life and eternal freedom.
