Greetings church family,

Growing season is fully upon us. The pictures of the "first fruits" from our gardens have begun to show up on the different forms of social media that people use. I have already seen pictures of home grown strawberries, kale, lettuce, and horse radish shared by friends. There is great joy in sharing with others what

our gardens have produced. The interesting thing about that is that God also feels great joy in the bearing of fruit. Jesus says, "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples." (John 15:8)

Of course, this is not referring to "fruits" that come from our gardens but the spiritual fruit that comes from our spiritual journey. The process, in a way, is really a lot simpler than growing something in a garden. When we grow stuff in our gardens we have to add soil amendments and prepare the soil so the plants will have the nutrients they need. After we have prepared the soil, then we must continue to make sure that the plants receive enough water and light. Before those plants get to the point where they bear fruit, we must watch and make sure that no pests or diseases destroy or damage the plant before it produces. Some might be thinking all that work is why we don't grow a garden. Some might be thinking if we can't grow anything in a garden, how can we grow spiritual fruit? What must we do to be able to bear this fruit?

Jesus describes it this way,

"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing." (John 15:4, 5)

Jesus says that we must abide in Him. It might be hard to understand what it means to "abide" in Him. This word can also be translated to stay, to remain. The idea is that if we stay in Jesus, remain with Jesus then we will just bear fruit. So, to grow spiritual fruit we don't have to amend soil, water, or watch for bugs or diseases. When we abide with Jesus He takes care of all those things for us. We simply must stay with Him and He will guide us and help us to bear "much fruit."

As we continue to go through this growing season and see all the fruit, I would challenge us to ask ourselves some questions. Are we bearing spiritual fruit? If the answer to that question is no, then we should ask ourselves are we still abiding, remaining, and staying with Jesus. Let's get back to Jesus so that we can glorify God. If the answer to that question is yes, then we can take pleasure in the fact that we are glorifying God and proving to be His disciples.
