Greetings church family,

Recently I was reading about something called the negativity bias or negativity effect. This is the definition of this effect or bias, "the notion that, even when of equal intensity, things of a more negative nature (e.g. unpleasant thoughts, emotions, or social interactions; harmful/traumatic events) have a greater effect

on one's psychological state and processes than neutral or positive things." We allow the negative things to have a greater influence on us than the positive thing. There is a serious problem with this.

The Bible has some things to say about negativity. I believe that one of the most powerful verses about negativity can be found in the wisdom literature. Proverbs 17:22 tells us that, "A joyful heart is good medicine, but a broken spirit dries up the bones." Recent studies are only proving what one of the wisest men on earth long ago told us. The idea presented in this verse is that our state of being or thought can have an impact on our bodies. The term "broken spirit" can just as easily be translated to be a stricken mind. Science is proving that this negativity, broken spirit or stricken mind has a horrible impact on us. The verse tells us on the other hand that a joyful heart is good medicine. So how can we have that joyful heart?

One Bible verse tells us this about God, "Honor and majesty surround Him, strength and joy fill his dwelling" (1 Chronicles 16:27). If we abide in the presence of God the "joy" that fills His dwelling will overflow into our lives. One of the things that I like to do is bask in the glory and presence of His creation. Psalm 19:1 says, "The heavens are telling of the glory of God and their expanse is declaring the work of His hands." When I contemplate these glories, I am once again drawn to my Creator, Redeemer and Savior. Don't let the negativity bias or effect be the guiding principle of your life. Draw near to God so that with the psalmist you too can say, "The Lord is my strength and shield. I trust him with all my heart. He helps me, and my heart is filled with joy" (Psalm 28:7).

So as we continue to enjoy the nicer weather, I challenge you to abide in the presence of the Almighty. I will seek His presence in the wonderful creation He has made all around me and I hope that you will too.

Update on Alex Buchanan

It has now been 5 years since Alex took that fateful bicycle ride just after graduation at Southern University. The crash that day changed his life from a buoyant young man planning to go on for his masters in social work to a man dependent on others for providing every necessity of life, adding to his identity quadriplegia.

Though his physical status has been changed, his mental attitude is one of hope, not of some pie-in-the-sky or chasing some weird treatment that offers fantastic benefit, but cannot produce. He is looking forward to the day when proven medical treatment or surgery such as stem cell transplant may help him walk again.

To maintain vigor and optimum strength of his muscles, bones, and joints he is undergoing therapy at a gym where especially skilled trainers work with him every week followed by vigorous exercises performed by his caregiver at home. He understands this therapy does not offer any miracles, but keeps him in optimum condition for stem cell surgery when it becomes available.

You have already been involved in Alex's therapy through giving to the Family Resource Network, but he wants to become fully independent. He has been very successful in selling items donated to him or given to him on consignment through E-bay and Craig's list, but is limited by the number of items he has received. He is able to sell a wide variety of goods, such as camera equipment, jewelry, hobby items such as stamps, and electronic equipment, but he can also sell more bulky items such as bicycles or furniture.
