# Greetings church family,

Elementary school students are not old enough to drive, work or vote. But that doesn't stop them from managing businesses, operating banks, opening bank accounts and writing checks at JA BizTown! This past week I had the opportunity to go to JA BizTown with several of the local Adventist elementary

schools. It is meant to blend in-class learning with a one-day economic simulation within an 8,500 square foot replica of an American city. The facility is set up to allow the students to have a 4.5-hour "workday" experience.

It was interesting to see how exhilarated the students were when they first arrived at the facility. As soon as the workday got started. the excitement began to change to anxiety for some of them. Every single one of them had manuals that gave them step-by-step instructions on what to do. As they began to go through their individual manuals, it became clear that some of them were getting overwhelmed. It was the same look and emotions that I have experienced at times when attempting to follow the IRS tax instructions for some forms. It was the same look some recent college graduates get when they have to start "adulting." As I attempted to aid them through the process, I was struck with gratitude.

An overwhelming sense of gratitude welled up in my heart for the clarity and simplicity of the gospel. There are no manuals or complicated booklets of instructions. Some make the gospel more complex because they are used to life in our society and culture. We sometimes fall into the trap of thinking that the gospel has to be more complicated because everything around us is that way. I do not believe that Jesus wants to complicate our lives or cause us anxiety. It is guite the opposite. He called us and said, "come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30, New International Version).

What feelings have "adulting" been stirring in your heart and life? Have you found yourself feeling overwhelmed and anxious at times? Has it made you think that the gospel must be complicated? Maybe it's time to accept the invitation given by the Savior himself. Maybe it's time to accept the call and invitation of Jesus. Accept his call, uncomplicate your life and accept the rest that He wants to give you.
