Hello church family!

I am going to follow Pastor Wendy's lead and tell you my personal story to help all of you get to know me a little better. If you would have told me even five years ago that I would be your new associate pastor I would have not believed you.

It was July 9, 2016, and I was sinking deeper into the water and the pressure

began to build around me. If any of you have gone deep under water you know the immense pressure and silence that accompanies you at these depths. With my eyes open I looked up and thought, this is it, this is where I am going to die. In fact, it was where I died. It was my baptism! My pastor dunked me deep under water and held me there for a while because both he and I knew with my past I needed it. I died to Christ that day and became forever His and since then have been living my life, with tons of mistakes, and to the best I can to follow His lead and example.

I do not come from a Christian home. In fact, when I first heard that my now wife was an Adventist, I had to Google what that even meant! Growing up I was really good at one thing, throwing a baseball. It was my dream to be a professional baseball player and I got very close. With a full-ride scholarship to play baseball as a pitcher, I put every single ounce of what I had into achieving that dream. One day, as I was playing ultimate frisbee with friends, I landed awkwardly on my knee and tore my ACL and MCL. I was hoping to correct it with rehab and get back into playing again, and the exact day I was cleared for full activities I tore my other ACL and MCL sledding in one of my home towns of Jackson Hole, Wyoming. That was the end of my career as a baseball player, as I began to take the hint that I should try to live my life a little different now.

When I left baseball, I now had this enormous gap in my life that I tried to fill with everything I possibly could (I often think of Ecclesiastes 1:14 here). This led me to many addictions in my life and a pursuit of finding that one thing that would satisfy my soul and make my life worth living. I became an accountant obtaining my Bachelor's degree in Accounting at Colorado State University and began my work up the corporate ladder at Centura Health in Denver, Colorado. Finishing school didn't save me, the title of accountant didn't save me, the money sure didn't help me out either. It only got worse.

That was until the day I met this sweet beautiful blonde girl named Chelsea. She called me Ben the first time we met and accused me of stealing candy from the ladies who worked with us (ask her about that story when you meet her). Even with that traumatic beginning we both knew that this was the person we were supposed to be with. Going on walks with Chelsea was, and still is to this day, the thing that continually centers me. When we first started going on walks we talked about Adventism and topics such as this weird word for Saturday, and how everyone sleeps when they die, and how they don't eat meat! (I used to eat 4 pieces of bacon, two eggs, and sourdough toast every morning when I met her). She left on vacation and gave me the name of a speaker that I should listen to. When she came back from her vacation I had an entire legal pad full of notes that I wanted to ask her. Being overwhelmed with the amount, and enormity, of the questions she sent me to my pastor who is the one that held me under the water as deep as he could on July 9.

After my baptism I struggled deeply because I thought my baptism and being an Adventist would fill that hole that baseball left. Again on another walk with Chelsea she asked me what I was missing in life and what I wish I had. I spouted off about 5 things that included meaning, purpose, and direction in life. She told me I needed to pray for God's will in these things and that I should seek Him to find what I needed in my life. That very night I was praying and reading an ESV study bible I had received from my in-laws, Rob and Lisa Foster. Reading the introduction to Romans a scholar of the Apostle Paul wrote that not only did Paul find reconciliation for his sins in Christ, he also found meaning, purpose, and direction in his life through preaching the resurrection of Christ. It was that moment that my hole was filled in following Christ with all of my heart, while continually stumbling, and telling others about His love for them.

My wife Chelsea and I have recently added to our family a cute Golden Doodle puppy named Dunder who is full of love for other dogs and people. Personally, I enjoy cooking, eating, hiking, triathlons, fishing, golf, rock climbing, and basically anything outdoors. Please contact me if you would like to be outside and meet as in these rare times I would love to meet my new church family anywhere I can!



Coming to you as a new pastor in this role God has gifted me with an administrative background working in finance for a few years in the corporate world. He has also blessed me with an Apostolic compass, and a passion on how to live life abundantly (John 10:10) here on this earth. Everything I do I try to incorporate how it can reach those that are not in the church, and how we can be a church on mission together in our beautiful city of Portland, Oregon. My prayer for this calling from God is that, as James 1 in the Message translation states, I will "lead with my ears." Listening to your amazing ideas for how you can see Sunnyside be a blessing to those inside the church and outside as well. I am looking forward to meeting and getting to know all I can in any way that we are allowed. Working collaboratively, and with much innovation, to reach as many as we can.
