<u>This world is not my home I'm just a</u> passing through...

OK! don't judge me for why I remember that song or who you may remember as the artist who sang it but this week's sermon is focusing

on a special group of people taken captive, removed from their home country, and placed (planted, if you please) in a totally foreign world. We will read about young people now expected to live in a very different culture, absolutely counter to what they had been taught and to what they had been accustomed.

Some of us may know what it is like to have to move from one culture to another. We may have done it as a matter of choice or in pursuit of a sense of God's mission and purposes. We may even have done this huge change as refugees, trying to find a better life for ourselves and for our families.

But the young men in Daniel 1 probably did not choose this change. And yet they found themselves in a completely different environment, surrounded by values that contradicted what they knew from their parental homes and communities.

On Sabbath, Pastor Mark is going to share with our Church Family what it means to *Grow Where You Are Planted*.

I must admit that life in the North West gives so many of us comforts and pleasures of living that we take for granted. For most of us, life here is very different from the trauma and tragedy of so many other places in this world. And yet, I pray God directs our minds to the reality of really growing here where God has planted us. I pray you will grow a fully God-blessed personal life, rich in the real values of His Kingdom. I pray that you will grow like a tree of righteousness, a tree of life. I pray you will grow...

> ... like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers. (Psalm 1)
