Hello, Sunnyside family!

It's easy to fall into routines. This is no less true in spiritual matters than mundane. Most of us have fallen into a pattern of spiritual disciplines of prayer and Bible study. These two disciplines are foundational and enriching, but they are not all the Bible teaches about how we can connect better to God.

I believe that if we're willing to explore a little deeper into the Bible's teachings on spiritual practices, we will find ourselves in much closer communion with our God. As a result, I've started using this space to share a few disciplines that I've found in the words of God. The last two times, we talked about rejoicing, but some of you may have noticed that we didn't actually address suffering. This week is for you.

This week, we are talking about lament.

It might seem strange that I call lament a spiritual discipline, but it is! And more than that, I would venture to say that it is likely the mostly neglected spiritual discipline in our churches today.

Think about how we usually talk to each other in church:

"This week, such and such happened, but it was such a blessing because ."

Or:

"This week was....long, but that's why I'm so grateful to be able to come to church and rejoice in the Lord!"

Or especially:

"Happy Sabbath!

We have created a modern church culture of something I like to call "crocheted-pillow Christianity." What I mean by this is that we have this idea that to be a good Christian, we must always be happy and content and at peace. And so we have learned that in speaking with other Christians, we must use language that carefully hides the imperfect parts of our lives behind trite sayings that don't really reflect our experience or how we feel.

But in scripture, we find that God's people are often expressing all kinds of uncomfortable feelings. There's even an entire book devoted to and named after this process: Lamentations.

Lament is the process of speaking aloud the sorrows of your heart and the troubles of your life. It is the act of bringing the ugly, dirty, broken, and sharp parts of your life before God and saying, "Here is what I'm dealing with. Here is what I'm feeling."

It can feel wrong, unholy, or even blasphemous to tell God just what we think and feel sometimes. But far from being improper, this is exactly what God asks of us! Jesus said, "Come to Me, all you who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest." God earnestly desires us to bring to Him all our troubles and cares and disappointments — even our disappointments in God Himself.

So this week, read one of the Psalms of lament, read some of Lamentations, or maybe a little of Ecclesiastes.

Then find a quiet place, and bring your own lament before God.

Learn to say with the Psalmist:

"All my longings lie open before you, Lord; my sighing is not hidden from you. My heart pounds, my strength fails me; even the light has gone from my eyes. My friends and companions avoid me because of my wounds; my neighbors stay far away" (Psalm 38:9-11).
