The first week of the year has arrived, and our students are back to their regular school routines.

The new year is upon us and with that comes a kind-of “reset” energy that permeates our calendars, schedules, and priorities. As for our household, the first few weeks of the year are spent reflecting on how God has led us in 2025 as we goal-setting for the upcoming year.

One of those priorities for 2026 is to host 100 new people at our new place.

Ambitious? Very likely.

But the more we experience the tyranny of 24-hour news cycle, the ubiquity of hatred and vitriol in online and offline spaces, and the desire to not just be friendly, but to embrace the risk of making friends, Elynn and I are convinced that one of the best spaces to dismantle the forces of darkness is around a dinner table, with food and drink, shared with others. So last Sabbath, we crowded in 23 young professionals and two cats in our tiny living room in what we’re hoping will be a ritual that might remind us that “church” can also exist outside of 11:15am and 12:30pm PST on a Saturday morning.

Church also happens at “Taco Tuesdays” where I bring tacos and hang out with our high schoolers and their friends at Portland Adventist Academy during Tuesday lunch, one-on-one sessions with students hearing their heart and mind through home visits with families of parents, or at impromptu lunches with Walla Walla nursing students, taking them out between classes.

Pray for us as we prepare to make chai for 100+ collegiates and young adults in two weeks (January 24-26) at Big L Camp.

If you’re a guest, (or one of our members) myself and my pastoral colleagues will be lingering in the foyer. We would love to check-in with you and say hi, if possible.
