Hi Sunnyside Family,

This past week was a week of "firsts."

Last Friday, we launched a brand new interactive worship experience for 18-35-year-olds called "OVERFLOW" which happened in our newly renovated youth room. After a catered dinner of "abuelita-approved" (grandma-approved) tacos and horchata, it was inspiring to see 100+ collegiates and young adults usher in the Sabbath. This will be a monthly event, repeating every first Friday night of the month, where students can enjoy fellowship and discuss contemporary issues through praise and peer-to-peer discussion groups.

Last Tuesday, we launched "NOURISHED"- a weekly bible study for our colleagues and emerging adults. This space was initiated by ASWWU Portland – the student body council of Walla Walla University – out of a need to explore Scripture in community. I had the pleasure of training a stellar group of students who are going to be bible study leaders along with me for this experience that happens after Bread Night (Thank you David and team!)

Last Saturday, we launched "The Table" – a cozy, communal space for 18-35-year-olds to engage with Scripture over a Sabbath meal provided by our Sunnyside members. This effectively replaces our young adult sabbath school class which used to happen at 10:00 a.m. Unsurprisingly, shifting the time to after divine service has allowed for more attendance and participation in discussion, especially for this demographic. If you're interested in flexing your cooking skills and providing a dish for hungry college students, either Pastor Violeta or I would love to hear from you!

This weekend (Oct 11-12) Elynn and I will be in Bend doing chai and speaking for the "On This Rock" event. This is an outdoor faith experience that brings in close to 500+ young adults, Christian and non-Christian, from all over Oregon, and we're excited to be a part of it. This upcoming Sunday, I have also been invited to speak at the Antioch Church in Bend – a non-denominational Christian community – for both their services. Looking forward to representing Sunnyside and learning from them.

While all this is going on, in between events, I've been working on my paper for the upcoming American Academy of Religion that Pastor Seth and I will be attending in late November. Please pray that I don't put myself in a position where late-night coffee or all-nighters might be a necessity.

There's been a lot of momentum and moving parts. But we take comfort in the fact that God is the author and the perfector of our faith and plans. Thankful for a supportive pastoral team and a supportive church.


each a chance to connect, share stories, and build relationships. If you have joined us within the last year, you are invited!


Wednesday mornings at 10:00 our Men's Bible Study group meet to study the Bible together in the Youth Room. Men, you are all invited to join us for this weekly study.


A MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR ODETTA AULANI WAHINEHOOKAE COURSER


What is a comfort shawl?
