Hi Sunnysiders,

A few weeks ago I was sharing the Sabbath message at our sister church, Healing Hope, when I met a woman who had moved to the United States only sixteen days earlier. After the service, as I was

greeting people, she asked where I was from. When I said "Melbourne, Australia," she replied, "Oh, I have been there. My daughter lives in Geelong!" I was surprised for two reasons. First, it is not often that I meet someone here who has visited Melbourne. Second, Geelong, a smaller city about an hour from Melbourne, is where my sister lives and serves in pastoral ministry.

We talked a little longer, and she shared that she has family in the United Kingdom, Australia, Ethiopia, and the United States. Her visit to Healing Hope was her first Sabbath worship experience at a church in Portland, and she had come alone. I told her that the Sunnyside Church family has an Ethiopian community and that she would likely find a connection there. We exchanged phone numbers, and she is planning to visit.

I love how God orchestrates divine appointments. Sometimes we do not know why we are in a certain place at a certain time. We may expect one thing, only to realize later that God brought us there for an entirely different purpose. If this lady had visited Sunnyside first, we might not have connected in the same way because it is a much larger church. What she needed that day was a personal connection.

Has God shown up in a divine appointment for you this week? Take a moment to reflect. You might be surprised by how He works through the small coincidences and surprises of daily life.

See you this coming Sabbath! I am looking forward to sharing the message titled "What is in Your Hand?" as we explore the life of Moses and his willingness (and sometimes unwillingness) to go where God sends.

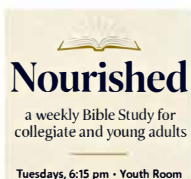
Christmas Evensong will be on December 20, at 4:00 PM, here at Sunnyside Adventist Church. The program will feature arrangements of holiday favorites from J.S. Bach and Brahms, as well as recent works by Melvin West and Paul Fey (an arrangement of the Widor *Toccata* combined with *O Come All Ye Faithful*). Also included will be singing of several favorite carols and an improvisation by the organist. The full range of sounds from the Rieger organ will be featured, from the quietest whisper to the thundering full organ. It will be presented by Michael Koller on the organ and Loren Dickinson with the spoken word. Several of the selections were arranged by Melvin West. Loren Dickinson and Melvin West lived next door to each other for some 12 years during their teaching careers at Walla Walla College (now University). It was during their many gab sessions that the idea of this vesper-type service, *Evensong*, was born. Doctor Dickinson was looking for an opportunity to present some of the wonderful gems of literature, while at the same time Doctor West was exploring the possibility of a vesper-type program with the organist providing several compositions, but relieved by readings from literature. So it seemed a natural to create an EVENSONG program in which the organ music was separated by selections from literature.



Come join us on Monday evenings to study the book "Last Day Events." We'll be going through this book discussing the words of E.G. White regarding the final days and how we can best prepare for them. This is an informal book club, we check in with each other, read the book, discuss what we've read and then pray for those on our hearts. Our history class meets on Tuesdays at 7:15 pm, in the Youth Room. We will study "World War I." **No meeting this week of Thanksgiving.**



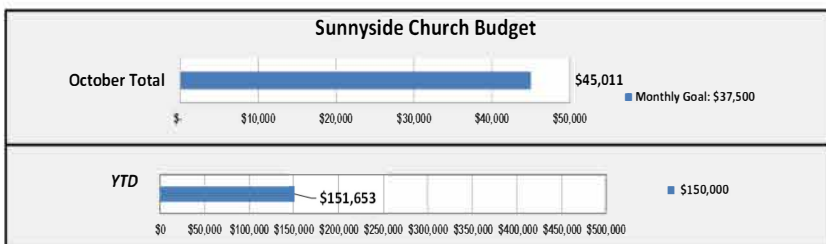

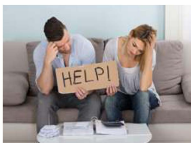
Currently, we are seeking volunteers to help us with video, audio, and the children's division. Please call 503-252-8080 if you would like to get involved.

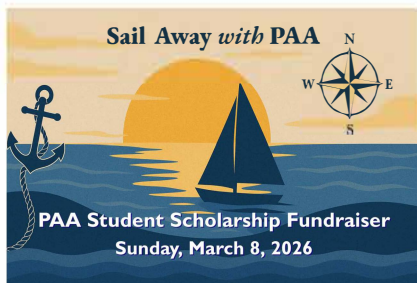

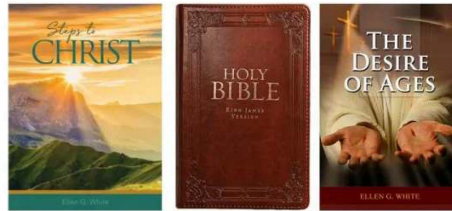
