# Greetings, Sunnyside Family!

I will never forget the photo that Pastor Ben Bilan showed me of the damage to the Ukrainian church after a bomb had exploded next to it. That photo, with the windows blown out and the pews covered in shrapnel, is seared into my memory. He showed me just a few minutes before 11:15 on Sabbath morning and

asked if we could pray as a church together. I remember the feeling I had when we all prayed together for the church in Ukraine, the people of Ukraine, and the war that had just broken out there. The feeling I had is one of unity. Each person in the sanctuary was united in asking God for help.

For myself, there is nothing better to help me with emotions like fear and anger, and also my judgment of others than to gain an understanding of a person or a situation. In Matthew 7, Jesus is telling a story about judging others and he tells us to take out the plank in our own eye before we can see clearly to remove the speck of sawdust in our brother's eye. Do you know how close you need to be to someone to see a speck of sawdust in their eye? Closer than I am sure all of us would be comfortable with. But closeness comes with knowing, and loving comes from understanding.

Much like Ben's photo of the church in Ukraine, with our understanding and seeing it for ourselves we all, though praying for Ukraine separately, were not joined together in unity of prayer as a church and giving as a church, until we got close enough to see what was happening.

We have an amazing opportunity as a church to get close enough to see what is happening in the conflict in the Middle East. No doubt you have been following the conflict in the Middle East between Israel and Hamas. A colleague and friend of Pastor Seth's, Christopher Banks, reached out and asked if we would be interested in having him share about the issues related to the conflict. Christopher is an Oxford-trained Adventist scholar who is extremely knowledgeable about world events and taught in the International Relations Program at Union College. He has a way to make world events spiritually relevant and appropriate, as well as informative, for Sabbath presentations. After checking with members of the church board and getting their wisdom, we have invited Christopher to give a special sanctuary presentation on November 11th during our Sabbath School time. This is also Parent's Weekend for WWU across the street, so it allows us the possibility of inviting them to a special program as well. While we encourage all classes to attend, we know regular meetings together are also vital and our teachers work hard, so we aren't making anyone cancel. However, if you can spare one week, I believe this will be an exceptional program. We will also stream and record it for

those who are unable to attend.

Thank you for making space so we can take advantage of this special moment to keep ourselves informed and encouraged as we watch global events unfold.

I pray that we can gather together as a community to get a closer look and begin to love more clearly in ways that only God can provide!


