Hi Sunnyside family,

I'm finally back on my feet after battling the flu for two weeks—the longest I've ever been sick! Being house-bound really tested my patience.

The Latin root of "patience" is pati, meaning "to suffer," which is why patience is often synonymous with "long-suffering." Waiting, in essence, is a form of suffering!

In a world that has conditioned us to crave instant gratification, few people enjoy the experience of waiting. However, as I read through Scripture, it seems that God likes to wait.

J.I. Packer expresses it this way:

"Wait on the Lord' is a constant refrain in the Psalms and it is a necessary word, for God often keeps us waiting. He is not in such a hurry as we are, and it is not His way to give more light on the future than we need for action in the present, or to guide us more than one step at a time. When in doubt, do nothing, but continue to wait on God. When action is needed, light will come."

I never expected the flu to take two weeks to recover from, but my nurse friends who cared for me warned, "The flu this year is different, Rose!" By day four, I confidently told them I was on the mend and ready to get out of the house. They simply nodded, saying little. The next morning, however, my fever spiked to 103°F, and I spent the entire day asleep. There was no clear timeline for recovery—I just had to take it one day at a time and wait it out.

While housebound, I started listening to an Audiobook, "Waiting isn't a waste" (...perhaps God is trying to teach me something?) and the author, Mark Vroegop, shared some profound insights about waiting:

"Waiting requires living by what I know to be true about God when I don't know what's true about my life."

"Waiting is an act of obedience. Waiting is abiding. Waiting connects us to hope. Waiting gives feet to our faith, even if those feet are called to be still instead of run around in circles. Waiting isn't about what is happening to us, but what could happen in us."

As I waited to recover, there was nothing I could do to "speed up" the healing process. I had to trust that my body was working to fight the infection, sending white blood cells to do their job at a cellular level. My role was simply to support my immune system by staying hydrated and getting enough rest.

What have I learned over the past two weeks? Waiting isn't wasted time. Just as our t-cells and macrophages quietly battle infections at a cellular level, God is constructively working behind the scenes of our lives; He is for us! (Rom. 8:31.) If you're in a season of waiting, trust that God is moving. You may not know the "when," but you can trust the "Who."

Mission to Palawan Island, Philippines March 19 – April 2, 2025

We invite you to partner with Sunnyside to reach the people of Palawan Island with the love of Jesus. We are working closely with the Palawan SDA Mission to hold reaping evangelism services across the island as well as help with a medical clinic providing necessary care to the people.

Palawan is the westernmost island of the Philippines, the largest by area, and a sought-after natural wonder. The island is home to 87 different cultural groups. About three-fourths of the population is Roman Catholic, 10% is Muslim, and 3.4% are Seventh-day Adventist. The major languages are English, Tagalog, and Ilonggo, alongside the native languages of Cuyonon and Palawanon.




In the summer of 2023, Executive Secretary of the Palawan SDA Mission Pastor Eliezer Barrientos visited Sunnyside Church by invitation of the Oregon and Washington Adventist Filipino Fellowship (OWAFF). That Sabbath afternoon he shared with us his vision to hold multiple evangelism series across the island of Palawan, all at the same time! We provide the evangelists for 11 different preaching sites going for eight nights, followed by a mass gathering on Sabbath, March 29, and baptism.

Also, we will participate in a comprehensive medical clinic, providing checkups, medicines, vision and dental care, health lectures, and spiritual counseling. The organization of the clinic will be under the leadership of the Health Director of Palawan Mission. Licenses will not be required from us since we will be working alongside their health professionals.

Please consider participating in this mission project with your prayers, support, and hopefully participation! We need preachers and medical volunteers. The cost per participant is \$3,000. This includes airfare, board, and expenses of the medical clinic, Bible workers, etc. With God's help, this will be a bigger success than anyone can imagine. 
