Greetings!

A story is told of the infamous Japanese tea master Yusai Hosakawa - a Japanese tea master - who made tea for the warlord Hideyoshi, but he had to do something unprecedented. Tea master Hosakawa made the tea, but during the service, the young attendant of the warlord Hideyoshi accidentally dropped the invaluable tea ware,

breaking it into five pieces. The warlord was furious and raised his hand against the attendant to punish him.

But just at the right time, the tea master stepped in between them. He sang a poem that resembled a 9th-century Japanese romance poem but contextualized the words masterfully to communicate the need for atonement and unity.

Through this public and hauntingly beautiful act of poetic justice, Hideyoshi atoned for the young servant and took responsibility for his actions. It was almost as if he said: "I will be the one to be blamed for his mistake."

But the tea master does not stop there.

He then put the five pieces together through the very intricate Japanese Urushi lacquer using gold gilding, making the broken teaware even more beautiful than the original. This would be the start of "Kintsugi" pottery; the art of making broken pottery even more beautiful and valuable than they were before.

In a time where Christianity is often used simply as a political propaganda tool to preserve power or a prescription drug to remove the symptoms of one's restlessness, the resurrection of Jesus reminds us that there's more to the story.

Easter reminds us that the ultimate point of theology - the art and practice of faith-seeking understanding - isn't just to "fix" our broken lives, and societies or "defend" our worldview to others, but to inspire creative and holistic ways to minister to those around us in order to carry out the "ministry of reconciliation"; the beautiful embrace of justice and beauty needed to build bridges between "us" and "them."

Easter reminds me that the "cracks" of my world, and the ruptures of the world can be made new and holy and beautiful because of a God who makes all things new, every day, and every moment, through the sacrifice of his life and death.

It is indeed a gentle reminder that the worst news is never the last news.

That even in the midst of pain and brokenness,

Life is beautiful.




