Hi Sunnyside Family!

Elynn and I were at PACS this past Tuesday to do a "ChaiXperience" where we did a live tea demo and served chai to all who attended. After the event, Linda, a seasoned volunteer at PACS, came up to me and said that the experience reminded her of the Eucharist.

Intrigued by her response, I asked her to tell me more.

"I used to be a hospital chaplain..." she began. "When you see a family member of a dying patient place a small piece of their favorite food on their tongue right before they release their final breath, I believe that that food item becomes Eucharistic. I like to think that food and drink becomes the presence of God for them in that precious moment. God is with them through that piece of chocolate. God is with them in the drop of Ginger Ale. I am no theologian, but I see the Eucharist every day in my interactions with people. I see the move of God in the ordinary."

"We have four Gospels available to us in the Bible." She continued. "But we also have a fifth Gospel: the presence of the Holy Spirit working in and through our lives to be love agents to those in our circles of influence."

At our young adult event last Saturday organized by the Oregon Conference, Dr. Argue mentioned in passing that "righteous theology always has a name and place." In other words, our understanding of God and his relationship with us, when rightly communicated, is never isolated from specific people and the contexts in which we know them. If that is true, and if what Linda said is true, I like to think that in addition to a name and place, life -giving theology also has a "taste" and a "smell" — a flavor and aroma that is so distinctly pleasing and attractive that it cannot be ignored.

As I looked at Linda's cup of chai and the freshly baked cookie, I saw, instead, bread and wine; a version of what Jesus might have shared with his friends before his dying moments. It reminded me that food and drink, for the Christian, aren't simply "fuel" to power our bodies and prove our worth to the communities we are a part of, but sacraments of grace through which we can care for our neighbors.

This week,

may your cups be containers for compassion.

may your plates be places for healing.

may your forks, spoons, and knives be instruments of God's love.






WWU Bread Night! Why do we feed the Walla Walla University Nursing students weekly? Here's a story submitted by David Duffied in explanation:

It was a little second- or third-grader, who was trying to not look embarrassed that he didn't have a lunch to eat when everyone else had a lunchbox full of food. 
