As I prepare for the class I am co-teaching with Dr. Kessia Renye Bennett, I want to share a tension to ponder this week. In the early days of American evangelicalism there was a great concern for the "least of these" and an impulse to reform society through various temperance movements (of which Adventists were a part). However, after the Civil War, disillusionment on human ability settled in and a "theology of despair" emerged, focusing on how Christ would rapture the Christians out of fallen society. As time has gone on, there have been moments where believers have sought to reform society or wait for it to burn in an end time conflagration.

We live in a constant tension of "now but not yet" when it comes to Christ's kingdom. While "we have this hope" that Jesus will return to make the world new, we also have a call to care for "the least of these" (Matthew 25). It can be a challenge, but practically this week, draw hope from the fact that the world's ultimate destiny doesn't rest on your shoulders, but that you are invited to use your hands and feet to bring good news, in word and deed, to those caught in the struggles of this life.

May God richly bless you this week and hope to see you Sabbath where we will enjoy a message from Pastor Rose!




What is a comfort shawl?


Last time we gave you an update, we had received \$147,000 towards our goal with \$43,000 of this amount being matched funds. During the month of March, we received significant donations that have allowed us to take full advantage of the remainder of all \$150,000 of matching funds! In total, we have received around \$385,000 for camp meeting! This puts us within \$5,000 of our fundraising goal!
