The Bible paints an inspiring picture of the early church in Acts 2, "All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved" (v. 45-47). While we often apply this to material goods, I think we can also see how this would apply to sharing our knowledge, expertise, and social networks.

I hope this story reminds you of one of the many reasons having a church community is so valuable and important. This week, keep your eyes and ears open for how you can share what God has given you to be a blessing.

Another important highlight for our church family, is that this week is Madi Jokela's last week as our pastoral intern! She has been a tremendous help to all our summer initiatives, including "Hanging On To Hope" which resulted in five baptisms. Her cheerful spirit and hard working energy have been such a blessing. We are so grateful she continues to worship with us here at Sunnyside as she begins another school year.

A wedding ring has been lost! Please keep watch — if you happen to find it turn it in to the office. Thank you!




Our history class meets on Tuesdays at 7:00 pm, in the Sandy Room. We will study "The Holy Land Revealed."
