I'm back from my trip home to Australia, and I've got to say—there's nothing quite like being back home.

Melbourne, nestled in the southeast corner of mainland Australia, is the country's second-largest city. It's a beautiful diverse place, full of flavor and creativity, and was recently named the World's Best Foodie Destination for 2025 (and honestly, I'm not surprised....)

Up until 2021, Melbourne held the title of the world's most livable city for seven years straight. While it's no longer number one, it's still consistently ranked in the top five. Going back made me realize just how much I love the city are everything it has to offer. It's funny how being away for a while can make you appreciate the little things you once took for granted.

After a few full weeks of family, friends, food, and fun, I was headed back to the United States—this time with a window seat from SFO to PDX. I'm usually an aisle person, but it was a short flight and the skies were clear, so I didr mind. I knew the flight path, and this seat meant I'd get a view of the snow-capped mountains of Northern California from above—they truly are breathtaking! As we flew over them, I was reminded just how lucky we are to have such incredible landscapes so close to home.

As much as I love the energy of the city, there's a different kind of peace I find in the mountains. Spending time in nature is linked to both cognitive benefits and improvements in mood, mental health, and emotional well-being. Tur out, our brains really do respond to the sight of natural environments. Functional MRI studies have shown that even glimpse—a flash of a natural landscape for just 1/100th of a second—is enough to activate areas of the brain linked positivity. It happens so fast, you wouldn't even be aware of it. On the flip side, images of cityscapes tend to light up parts of the brain associated with stress and threat.

The benefits of nature go beyond just feeling good. Studies have linked views of natural environments to improved focus, better work performance, and even higher academic achievement in schools.

We're incredibly blessed here in the Pacific Northwest with stunning summers and some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world. And while not everyone has the time or ability to hike the Wonderland Trail or make the steep climb up Dog Mountain, the beauty of nature is that its benefits don't require grand adventures.

Just a few moments outside—feeling the warmth of the sun on your skin, noticing the vibrant trees in full spring bloom, or listening to the quiet rhythm of birdsong—can be enough to lift your mood. As the days grow longer and summer settles in, make it a point to step outside with intention. Watch the trees sway, hear the birds sing, notice th way cherry blossom petals drift gently to the ground like snow.

There's a quiet reassurance in these simple moments. As Matthew 6:26 says, "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them." Nature lives in constant trust, free from worry, because it is cared for by the Creator—and it reminds us to trust that we, too, are provided for.

Looking forward to joining you all this Sabbath to reflect on the life of Jesus in our special Easter service.


