Hi Sunnyside Family,

"Where is home for you?"

Christmas is a "messy" season for TCKs like me who have homes in multiple places. Like some, I don't have the luxury of having all my family or my loved ones near me during this time. When we see empty chairs around our dinner tables, or don't see gifts from people who should've still been, Christmas brings with it mixed feelings of joy and pain, suffering and hope. It's complicated.

Of all of its different definitions, I've recently found my "home" in this definition of home by Egyptian Nobel Prize winner, Naquib Mahfouz: "Home is not where you are born. Home is where all your attempts to escape cease." In other words, home is where I find the most safety, comfort, and a sense of belonging. This space changes seasonally based on who I am with. And that's why home, for me, is not so much in places as much as they are in people.

Because of this relational scaffolding, what makes Christmas complicated is precisely what makes it accessible.

Jesus was born in the complicated space between the public and the palace. Mary and Joseph had to make their homes in multiple places as they escaped infanticide and political turmoil. The Magi from the East mostly likely traveled for months, periodically pitching their tents in uncharted territory and eventually reaching the manger of the infant King. Jesus can relate to both the shepherd and the prince.

So during this season, whether we celebrated with our Sunnyside youth and young adults at our Christmas gatherings, visited with families who are experiencing heartache and pain, participated in our various Christmas programs, I'm reminded that no matter who we are, and where we find ourselves, Christmas tells a story of a "God With Us."

God with us in our joy.

God with us in our place-lessness.

God with us in our brokenness.

God with us right now..

...In whom all my attempts to escape cease.

Mission to Palawan Island, Philippines March 19 – April 2, 2025

We invite you to partner with Sunnyside to reach the people of Palawan Island with the love of Jesus. We are working closely with the Palawan SDA Mission to hold reaping evangelism services across the island as well as help with a medical clinic providing necessary care to the people.

Palawan is the westernmost island of the Philippines, the largest by area, and a sought-after natural wonder. The island is home to 87 different cultural groups. About three-fourths of the population is Roman Catholic, 10% is Muslim, and 3.4% are Seventh-day Adventist. The major languages are English, Tagalog, and Ilonggo, alongside the native languages of Cuyonon and Palawanon.



In the summer of 2023, Executive Secretary of the Palawan SDA Mission Pastor Eliezer Barrientos visited Sunnyside Church by invitation of the Oregon and Washington Adventist Filipino Fellowship (OWAFF). That Sabbath afternoon he shared with us his vision to hold multiple evangelism series across the island of Palawan, all at the same time! We provide the evangelists for 11 different preaching sites going for eight nights, followed by a mass gathering on Sabbath, March 29, and baptism.

Also, we will participate in a comprehensive medical clinic, providing checkups, medicines, vision and dental care, health lectures, and spiritual counseling. The organization of the clinic will be under the leadership of the Health Director of Palawan Mission. Licenses will not be required from us since we will be working alongside their health professionals.




