Have you ever gotten so focused on something that you missed something else that was important?

I was in Kenya with a large group of people on safari in the Maasai Mara. We were out in the bush for most of the day seeing absolutely wonderful displays of God's creation. We saw giraffe, zebra, all kinds of

antelope, hippo, crocodile, lion, cheetah, and, well the list goes on. At the beginning of our journey, we gave all of our team a booklet for them to check off all the animals that they saw during our two days in the bush.

At the end of our second night, we were all gathered around the fire and everybody brought their safari books to compare what we saw and talk about the experiences. The highlight of everybody's trip was the rhino that we not only saw, but that charged one of our vehicles, missing it by just a few feet as the driver sped backward in reverse.

As we all shared our experiences, I noticed one young man not engaged in the conversation. When I asked about his experience, some of the teens in his group said, "Craig didn't see hardly anything because he was playing video games the whole time."

Sure enough, Craig didn't even know that we saw a rhino, a leopard, or a near kill by a cheetah running for a Thompson Gazelle. He was so focused on breaking a personal record on his electronic game that he missed the bigger, better experience.

Sometimes we can get so focused on what ultimately doesn't matter, we forget that there's a great big world out there that God has given us to be engaged in and add beauty to. Life can race by as we focus on unimportant things; distracting things.

Hebrews 12 gives us this admonition, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."

In 2022, let's turn off all the things that take our eyes off Jesus. In this new year let's keep our focus on the Savior so we won't miss out on the more abundant life He has in store for us.
