Greetings Church Family!

GOD ENCOUNTERS

Many of you are aware of some of the challenges I have personally struggled with since joining Sunnyside Church. The first week we were here in Oregon January 1, 2019, my father-in-law and uncle died the same day as movers were ready to bring in our belongings. Three months later my dad died on

March 3, 2019. These losses were crushing as I started my work at the Oregon Conference office.

In early 2020 the CDC started talking about this crazy virus called COVID-19 and soon it was a full-blown pandemic. Churches and businesses closed, and we began a time of incredible isolation. The hard part for me personally, was that I was unable for about eight months, to visit my mom in British Columbia, Canada. All borders were closed to out-of-country traffic. My mom was still reeling from the loss of my dad. Fortunately, my brother was able to provide caregiving for my mom since her health was not good. Those who know me, know that my mom was my best friend and even though we called daily it wasn't the same. Finally, in September 2020 I was able to start my visits to see my mom which came with a lot of red tape to get into my home country because of COVID-19 restrictions.

In August 2020, the Conference office was reconfiguring and laying off many of its workers or reassigning them. They knew of my love for Pastoral work, and I was thankful that they placed me at Sunnyside to work alongside Mark. The challenge was being hired as a family/children's pastor when there are no people at church including children. I was at a loss of what my role was in this unknown territory and felt like I was floundering. Not sure if my ministry was benefiting anyone or how to navigate this new challenge.

On August 13, 2021, my family got the gut-wrenching news that my mother's cancer had relapsed for the third time, and would be terminal. She would have four to five months to live if she was lucky. I took a family leave to be a caregiver for my mom during that time. Finally, we had to bring her to hospice where more intensive care could be done. Those times were precious with my godly, amazing mom. She passed away on December 10, 2021. I tell you all this not to feel sorry for me, but to understand that I was grieving so much and feeling lost in this calling of God, yet feeling useless like I had lost my way. My mom could tell I was struggling and I can still hear her prayer for me.

On March 16, Mark and I left to lead two groups in the Holy Land which included Israel, Jordan, and Egypt. God must have known that I needed this trip. He did something for me for which I will forever be grateful. My turning point was in Nazareth. We went to the village there to learn about first-century Nazareth — the way it would have been when Jesus was growing up there. We saw shepherds tending their flock, a potter, and a carpenter or stone builder. We also saw a farmer sowing his field. Among those Palestinian Christian actors was a woman named Hannah who was demonstrating weaving.

After her demonstration when most had moved on to the next station, I asked her if she would get a picture with me. Her reaction was one I was not prepared for. She gripped my hands and with tears forming in her eyes she said to me. "I see the Holy Spirit in you." The impact of those words had me thinking, "Is she talking to me? The one who is grieving and lost? I'm broken and isolated and have been struggling with my wilderness experience



questioning life, my calling, everything." Then she said, "Can I hug you?" We fell into each other's arms; two women on opposite sides of the world, but what brought us together was the love of God. In that embrace, I felt the amazing gracious love of my God wash over me. I felt so unworthy of this love but so grateful. It was like God was reassuring me of his love and He understood my grieving and floundering heart and He wouldn't give up on me. That is all I needed and I have returned feeling renewed, alive again, and with a purpose to share this love of our incredibly gracious God.

I don't know what you have been going through but I know for many these last few years have brought untold heartache and challenges. I want to let you know that your Father in heaven understands and He still has you. He still loves you even if you have floundered a bit. He is there for you and you can come alive again in Him to face whatever the next chapter brings. My prayer is that we shed our worries and cares leaving them with Him and take on His life of purpose to change the world around us with His love.
