Greetings church family,

It was a truck, rusted red and belching smoke into an already smoggy Portland day, late this summer. The sun was scorching the tip of my already-burned nose. I took a step or two around the side of the truck, and glanced through the cracked window. Inside was a gaunt, scruffy fellow with piercing eyes,

obsessively tapping his thumb and little finger against the steering wheel in an alternating, syncopated rhythm, lips in a thin line.

"This guy?" I raised an eyebrow at Tracy, my coworker at PACS.

She nodded. "Mm-hm. I think he wants to talk to a pastor."

"What makes you think that?"

She shrugged, then smiled, just a little.

I took another step and waved at him through the window, smiling. The man started, momentarily frozen, then all in a rush fumbled his door open, leapt from the car, and thrust his outstretched hand into my stomach.

What followed was a heartbreaking story: a broken childhood, an escape onto the streets and into addiction, and an arduous journey back to stability. He shared how he was for the first time in his life able to hold down a job, how he was in his own apartment paying rent on time, how he was barely making ends meet. Then he told of his mother coming to his doorstep and begging for him to take her in, to do for her what she failed to do for him.

Living with her would strain his tenuous mental health. Providing for her would push him financially to the brink of homelessness again. Caring for her was the last thing on earth he wanted to do.

He took her in.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12, ESV).

What is this light of life? Is it knowing the right things? Having the right doctrines? Conforming to a certain set of standards? Or is it something else?

What does light look like in the life of my friend in the rust-red truck?
