Greetings Church Family!

In the book of Third John, chapter one, the old apostle wrote, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."

Sunnyside Church, today I say to you that this is a time for that kind of joy. I've been working with the Pathfinders since they started meeting again this year, focusing on getting to know them and building relationships. One of the ways

we've been growing together is using worships as a chance to ask and discuss their questions about the Bible.

As we've gone along, we've talked about all sorts of things, but I've been especially focusing on teaching them how to think about the Bible and what it means to read it in context, to let it speak for itself as much as possible. And ladies and gentlemen, our kids in Pathfinders are in Scripture. They have dived into the discussions headfirst, engaging in the Word in deep, exciting ways. It is a genuine joy to watch them start to process, learn and grow as they confront the Bible they believe in, and put pieces together in ways that even I don't expect them to. It's exciting to be a part of a group that wants to ask real questions and is interested in seeking answers. They are, to put it plainly, actively engaged in the process John was talking about: the process of walking in truth.

It can sometimes be challenging for those of us who are settled and certain to engage in this kind of dialogue. It can be uncomfortable to entertain questions and engage in dialogue with people who don't think just like us, no matter the topic. But the text doesn't say to huddle behind the truth; it doesn't even say to stand firm in it. It says to walk in the truth. Walking is messy. It was even messier in the time John was writing. Walking gets your feet dirty and your legs sore, and you end the day tired and worn out. But walking is exciting too, though. You get to see lots of sights and talk to a variety of fellow travelers. You expand your horizons and always end up understanding yourself better, too. And so, I can't help but get excited when I see the children of Sunnyside strap on their sandals and start walking through Scripture together.

But of course, the apostle John was an elderly man when he wrote this. And it was the whole church that he saw as his children, the young and the old alike, and everyone in between. So the real question is, are you walking in the truth? What steps are you taking each and every day to engage in meaningful ways with Scripture? How often do you join together with fellow travelers, listening to their reflections and experiences? I invite you, this next week, to find a new way to get just a little bit dusty.
