



Hello Church Family!

Returning this week back home (Chelsea and I truly enjoy calling Portland and Sunnyside home), from visiting Chelsea's family in Texas, I hope each one of you were blessed and had a lot to be thankful for. Chelsea and I have started to talk about when we are going to make plans to go get a real tree to put in our living room for Christmas time.

As we turn the corner from fall and Thanksgiving towards Christmas I thought it would be fun to talk about what is talked about in the Bible before Jesus' birth. In our Young Adult Sabbath School (which is awesome by the way) we are currently reading through the gospels simultaneously. If you are interested in reading this on the YouVersion Bible App just search "A Harmony of The Gospels in 30 Days" and I know you will be as abundantly blessed as the Young Adult Sabbath School has been.

The three spots where there is significant mention in the gospels before Jesus' birth is in Matthew 1, John 1, and Luke 1. In the book of Matthew the main thrust of what I will call BCG or "Before Christ Gospel" is the genealogy of Jesus. This is incredibly important because we see a trend from Abraham to ultimate triumph in King David, back to a steep decline to the exile in Babylon, and ultimate fulfillment of the Abrahamic covenant with the birth of the Messiah, Jesus Christ.

In the gospel of John, specifically verses 1-14, John mentions Jesus as the "Word" and that in the beginning (much like Genesis 1) Jesus was there and He was with God. He is the light that gives light to <u>everyone</u>, and that Jesus became flesh and dwelt among us. Humbling himself he was full of grace and truth!

In the gospel of Luke, the entirety of chapter 1 is BCG. This first chapter of Luke is so important for us to understand because right off the bat he gives us his reasoning behind why he is writing this gospel and he discusses how he carefully investigated everything "from the beginning" (sound familiar like John and Matthew). He then goes on to talk about the birth of John the Baptist being foretold and the birth of Jesus foretold. He specifically mentions some miracles where Zechariah's mouth is shut during Elizabeth's pregnancy because of his unbelief in the promise, and how the Holy Spirit will conceive with Mary, and then when Mary visits Elizabeth John the Baptist, still in Elizabeth's womb, jumps!

Luke wrote in such detail "from the beginning" because he was a physician. In Colossians 4:14, Paul calls Luke the "beloved physician." As a physician, he believes and knows science and

science cannot explain a person's mouth being shut for months, and some invisible person conceiving with a human, and a baby jumping inside its mother's womb when another person walks into the room.

Luke was also a Gentile, which is not a Jew (we all know this, Billy). Why is this important? Two reasons: First, how cool is it that God the creator of the heaven and the earth chose a Gentile physician to write one of His gospels? I can guarantee you if we were to rewrite the story of Jesus none of us would pick a secular evolutionist; however, here we are being blessed by a Gentile physician. The second thing is found in the first 2 verses of Luke chapter 1. He uses one of the most basic two-letter words you can use with massive implication. That word is "us". A gentile physician, someone who literally is the exact opposite of a Jew is saying this is an account of "things that have been fulfilled among *us*, just as they were handed down to *us....*"

I'm not sure how you feel about yourself and how much you feel like you belong at the table of Christ, but I can tell you without a doubt that from the beginning God's plan has been for us all to be at the table. Paul says it best, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28)

Just like Matthew, John, and Luke (all three different people with different backgrounds) can all be in unison that from the beginning Jesus was there and His plan was to save the world, I am confident that from the beginning Jesus's plan was to spend eternity with you, and there is always room at the table for one more!
