Changing Our Community Three Miles-Per-Hour at a Time

Hey Church Family!

If I told you that you could change someone's life at a pace of three miles-per-hour you, like me, would say that this isn't fast enough. In our Western world today three miles-perhour seems like torture. If you don't agree, try getting in your vehicle and driving three miles-per-hour, I can

guarantee it is almost impossible. So, how can we change someone's life that slowly? Why can't we do it more quickly? There is a story in the gospel of Mark, in the fifth chapter, that gives us remarkable insight into how this is possible.

In Mark 5 beginning in verse 21 we read of a synagogue leader, named Jairus, that came and fell at the feet of Jesus. He pleaded earnestly with Him, "My little daughter is dying. Please come and put your hand on her so that she will be healed and live." So Jesus went with him. (Verses 23-24). As Jesus walks with Jairus a large crowd was following him and "pressed around Him." (v. 25). Then there was a woman who was there that was subject to bleeding for twelve years, not getting better with doctors' visits but actually getting worse. "<u>When she heard about Jesus</u>, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, because she thought "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed." Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering. At once Jesus realized that power had gone out from him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, "<u>Who touched my</u> <u>clothes?</u>" (Verses 27-30)

This is a fascinating story because here you have two individuals who are reaching out to Jesus in faith: a respected synagogue ruler and an unknown woman who was ritually unclean and disregarded in her community. One named, the other unnamed. Both risking reputation and potential shame by reaching out to Jesus. What is so interesting here is the disciples' reaction to Jesus asking, "Who touched my clothes?" I believe one of the reasons they did this because just like us most of our lives are just a bunch of accidental contacts. We will push and shove our way through life trying to get what we want and whoever we bump into we end up accidentally either blessing someone, or being blessed by them. However, Jesus was the most sensitive and intentional man that ever lived. When someone reached out in faith to Jesus, He knew.

The disciples had a singular mission, get Jesus to Jairus' house, and they didn't want any interruptions. However, Jesus was the King of being interrupted, as well as being the Interrupter; however, the question is, "Are we allowing Jesus to interrupt our lives?" Jesus didn't run to Jairus' house because He had so much to do (He did) that He couldn't spare another second but felt guilty because He promised Jairus He would help him. He walked. At three miles-per-hour Jesus walked and was interrupted.

"While **Jesus was still speaking**, some people came from the house of Jairus, the synagogue leader. "Your daughter is dead," (v. 35) Can you imagine Jairus' feelings when Jesus stopped to help someone else? Not only that but after He helped this unnamed woman He then began to preach and talk, and while this was going on Jairus' daughter dies. Can you imagine that? Jesus then tells Jairus to not be afraid and "just believe." (v. 36). Jesus heals Jairus' daughter (who, just as an FYI, was 12 years old, the same amount of time as the woman who was bleeding) and then tells them not to tell anyone and to give the little girl something to eat.

This story is absolutely fascinating! Here is what I would like to focus on. Jesus heals at three miles-per-hour. Jesus was not in a hurry to get to Jairus' daughter because He knew that God would provide. When He was interrupted by the unnamed woman He felt her reaching out to Him because He was allowing Himself to be interruptible. This leads me to ask the question, "If people in our nearest proximity were reaching out to us, would we know?"

Just like Jesus did in Mark 5 we are planning to reach the neighborhood surrounding Sunnyside church at threemiles-perhour. Starting March 13 we are going to walk around our neighborhood at three miles-per-hour and pray to God for healing for the community, as well as to allow ourselves to be interrupted by whoever we may run in to and to allow them to reach out to us if they are in need. We will also be handing out a prayer card at each house to allow them to digitally reach out to the church for those who may be in need.

Also, at the beginning of the story, we read that the woman had "heard about Jesus". She only heard about Him because someone told her. We cannot spread the love of God without telling others about Jesus. We will be having a non-traditional evangelistic series at the end of May and it will be a great opportunity to tell others all about Jesus. There may be individuals in our community, living literally right across the street from our church that have been "bleeding" for twelve years, some may be longer.

Here are three things I am asking and praying you would join in with us at the Sunnyside church:

- Come join us in our Community Prayer Strategy starting March 13 (the other dates are also on this communiqué).


