## Hello Church Family!

It's easy to fall into routines. This is no less true in spiritual matters than mundane. Most of us have fallen into a pattern of spiritual disciplines of prayer and Bible study. These two disciplines are foundational and enriching, but they are not all the Bible teaches about how we can connect better to God.

I believe that if we're willing to explore a little deeper into the Bible's teachings on spiritual practices, we will find ourselves in much closer communion with our God. As a result, I've started using this space to share a few disciplines that I've found in the words of God. The last time, we talked about celebration of the good and the great in our lives.

This week, celebration even through the bad and the horrible.

You might wonder what place celebration has in evil. This is a fair question, and it is worth noting that we should never celebrate in evil. But the Bible does call us to celebrate through evil, for three particular reasons.

First, we have reason to celebrate because there's a better place coming (e.g., Matthew 5:11-12). Jesus promised that eventually, He will return and rebuild the world in such a way that evil no longer has a place. That's good news, and the goodness of that news only grows as the badness around us grows.

The second is best illustrated by taking a detour to my favorite comic strip: Calvin & Hobbes. In the strip, whenever the little boy, Calvin, has to do something he doesn't like, his dad says, "It builds character!" This, of course, only makes Calvin grumpier. But if we can learn to view our troubles and tribulations as opportunities rather than inconveniences, we suddenly find that they are a whole lot lighter. So yes; we can celebrate because it builds character (e.g., Romans 5:1-5).

And finally, my favorite cause for rejoicing even when everything around is terrible. Habakkuk 3:16-19 goes like this:

I heard and my inner parts trembled; At the sound, my lips quivered. Decay enters my bones, And in my place I tremble; Because I must wait quietly For the day of distress, For our attackers to arise. Even if the fig tree does not blossom, And there is no fruit on the vine, If the yield of the olive fails, And the fields produce no food, Even if the flock disappears from the fold, And there are no cattle in the stalls.

Even still I will triumph in the Lord, I will rejoice in the God of my salvation. The Lord God is my strength, And He has made my feet like those of a deer, And has me walk on my high places.

The reality is, even when God doesn't fix things, even if all our prayers, pleas, and petitions are met with silence, God is still our salvation, God is still strengthening and supporting us, and most importantly, God is still with us.

So celebrate. Rejoice not in, but beyond suffering. And find that your burden is lightened, just a little.

And if you are one of those for whom this lesson rings hollow, for whom the darkness looms so large you cannot see through, no matter how hard you try, know that you, too, are a child of God. Your inability to see past the pain doesn't in the least lessen the love God has for you. The next in this series deals with the darkness directly, but until then, please don't suffer alone. Please reach out to a friend or family member, to myself, or to one of the other members of the pastoral staff. Let us lift you and love you.
