Hello Church Family!

I was recently reading an article about lent in the Catholic tradition and there is something really fascinating that happens during lent. If you are unfamiliar, most people practice lent by giving something up for 40 days. Maybe it is chocolate, alcohol, coffee, or meat. Whatever it is, the point is to give up

something you like in order to sacrifice what you want, as a practice of self-sacrifice and discipleship to Jesus.

Many of you that know me will know that I do like this idea; however, in reading up on lent I found something interesting. There was an old pastor who mentioned that what if instead of giving up the things that make us happy like chocolate, coffee, and sugary beverages, we gave up things like worry, anxiety, self-doubt, self-hate, and the things that actually make us miserable and not in line with what the Kingdom of God has in store for us. Now, this I LOVE!

Chelsea and I have started a new practice every Friday night to start Sabbath. With our girls now being 7 months old we wanted to make sure that we truly start to make the Sabbath something very important and we wanted to start practicing Sabbath in a much more spiritual and meaningful way. So what we have decided to do is every Friday night we light two candles, the remembrance candle, and the observance candle. The remembrance candle is for the Sabbath command in Exodus 20 and the Sabbath command in Deuteronomy 5.

Once the candles are lit we then take a few minutes and we write on a piece of paper our worries, anxieties, things we are sad about, and our to-do list. We write them down, fold them up and we place them in a box, our Sabbath box. When we do that we close the box up, pray over them, and then we cheer our mocktail drinks and say "Shabbat Shalom!"

This is like a miniature lent built into every week! Something that we don't need to look at as having to give up things that make us happy, but a way to celebrate and give to God what makes us miserable like worries, to-do lists, and the things we are sad about.

It is my hope that you try something like this. Try to give away the things that make us miserable and to delight in the Creator. Take some time to truly rest from the things that make us miserable and delight in the things that make us happy. Truly Sabbath!
