Hello Church Family!

As I write this we are home, safe and sound from another lengthy stay at the hospital. Ayla had a double ear infection, viral bronchiolitis, and bacterial pneumonia. Our stay brought back a lot of memories from a few months ago where every day was life or death with Ayla. As

Ayla was struggling to breathe I would take Adalee for walks by the NICU where we spent 44 days (who was counting), going to the spots where Chelsea and I would eat lunch and dinner and cry when Ayla would throw up all of her food and the nurses would have to suction her mouth and nose just so she could breathe. I took Adalee to our spots of prayer on the 9th floor of the Kohler pavilion with a beautiful view of Mt. Hood, where Chelsea and I would praise God that Ayla made it through the night.

Each area that I would take Adalee to brought back horrific moments and also beautiful ones. During Chelsea's first shunt procedure with Adalee, it was the most difficult two hours of my life so far, and as I sat on the phone with Pastor Mark and Arnold Petersen talking about what was happening, a member of Sunnyside, Ron Blehm, walked passed me, we both saw each other and he hugged me and said, "Everything is going to be ok." I will never forget that moment, I'm not even sure Ron remembers it but I will never forget it. A moment, in one of the most difficult times where the love of God showed up and Ron spoke words of life into me.

The world we live in right now looks a lot like the NICU at Doernbecher Hospital. Kids on life support, struggling to survive, needing medication and treatment just to make it to another day, and Sunnyside church and the people who fill the pews are no different. We are all struggling in one way or another, and while it is easy for me to say, "Go to God. Let him make you feel better." Sometimes that is not enough. And the best part is, that's ok. It's okay that bringing your worries to God is not enough. He understands and He wants to give you more.

It is scary for us to re-live traumatizing moments in our lives, and when we initially see the signs of the NICU, or press the button to head up to the 11th floor where you have carved a pathway out that you walked for hours while the lives of your wife and children were up in the air. The beautiful thing is that what we see, initially, is only the surface of the beautiful gift of the most promised promise in the whole Bible, that God is with us. Jesus' name literally means "God with us." (Matthew 1:23)

As I took Adalee around the hospital, somewhat afraid to hit the 11th floor button on the elevator and look down the hallway into the operating room where Chelsea was for hours as we sat there, and now this beautiful miracle was wiggling around in my arms, I was reminded that He was with me. I can look at all of the stories of the kids in that hallway where God intervened and they are walking around here on this earth, knowing that God was with them. In that space where he calmed me down through a hug from Ron, God was with me. When Ayla's heart was showing critical signs of not beating any longer, we had an ultrasound photo taken, more clear than any we had seen before, and God was with us.

My challenge to you is to sit in the moments you are afraid to approach. Hit the elevator button to the 11th floor, look down the hallway towards the operating room, and see where God was with you in those moments. When you do this, you just might look forward to pushing that button or looking down the hallway. You may even find joy in telling people where God was with you.


