
The Story of Sunnyside's Rieger

Organ – Part 6

The American Organist, June 1990, Volume 24, Number 6

Thanks to Dr. Wilfred Geschke, I was

privileged to get my actual hands on a copy of *The American Organist* (Vol. 24, No. 6) which features Sunnyside's then recently installed Rieger Organ with a grand cover picture and an article by Dr. Ed Cook. This journal is available on loan for anyone choosing to peruse its contents but the following are the relevant excerpts:



SUNNYSIDE SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH PORTLAND, OREGON RIEGER ORGELBAU COVER FEATURE

The Sunnyside Seventh-day Adventist Church was chartered in 1927 in Portland, Oregon. Since its beginning, the church has had ties to a sister institution, Portland Adventist Hospital. In 1977, the hospital relocated and became Portland Adventist Medical Center. By that time, the need for a new church building was also clear. A new church was built near the new medical center, and was occupied in 1983.

The old church used a unified and totally enclosed eleven-rank organ which was inadequate for a new building seating up to 600 people. The Sunnyside congregation always had included strong musicians in its membership and desired to maintain high quality in its music. The need for a new organ was obvious.

In the late 1970s, the building committee charged the keyboard committee with recommending an appropriate organ for the new church.

The committee began by identifying the needs that a new organ must meet. The first and most basic was to support congregational singing. Next, the church's growing choir needed an instrument versatile enough for accompaniment. There was also a desire for an organ that would contribute to the community, that musicians and concert artists would be proud to use and be associated with. The committee foresaw its use in evensong programs, concerts, weddings, music festivals and other events. It was recognized that these needs would best be served with an eclectic instrument, and specifications were developed accordingly.

The committee visited many pipe and electronic organs, in the San Francisco Bay area, Portland and Seattle. Individual members inspected other organs informally. The committee consulted with Melvin West, FAGO, during this time.

At least six estimates were received. Among the organs inspected by the committee, a Rieger organ made the most favorable impression. In July 1983 the committee recommended to the church board that a tracker organ be purchased from Rieger Orgelbau in Schwarzach, Austria. The organ was ordered in February 1985.

Consultation between Rieger and the architect called for reinforcing the floor and modifying the wall behind the organ. The height of the church building had been limited by neighborhood consensus, and the resulting low ceiling height required placement of the Swell division at the top rear of the organ. The organ is on one wall of a hexagonal sanctuary. The pews and aisles are absorbent; all other surfaces are reflective.


All but the electronic components for the combination action were built by Rieger. The electronics are from Heuss in Germany. The casework is of French oak. The pipe shades were painted on-site to complement the color theme of the interior of the church. The keys are bone and ebony. The Swell and Positiv are enclosed. The combination action has 16 memories, which accommodate the many organists using the organ. There are four programmable sequences available for the crescendo pedal. Wind pressures range from 58 mm to 70 mm, and the organ is tuned in equal temperament.


The final cost of the organ in U.S. dollars was about \$280,000. The first \$150,000 for the organ was included in the new church building budget. The remainder was raised by the Friends of the Organ.

When the 60% down payment was made, the church purchased a futures contract for the remaining 40% of the Austrian schillings due on completion of the organ. The futures contract was purchased on the same day that the dollar's value peaked against the schilling. By the time the organ was delivered on March 29, 1988, its replacement value had risen to about \$500,000 in U.S. dollars.

On June 25, 1988, the organ was dedicated, with Dr. West at the console. In the time since its dedication, it has served the congregation superbly for worship, special musical programs for the church and community organizations, and guest artists.

Music lovers in the church and community have grown to appreciate the instrument. Its ''melodies inspired by the sense of things divine are blent with a grandeur unknown before, are decked with new glory and might'' (Honoré de Balzac).
