# Greetings church family!

Matthew 5 is the beginning of the single greatest sermon ever preached. The "Sermon on the Mount" will always and forever, in my opinion, be the most Kingdom-driven words that have been and will ever be spoken. They are just as informative and relevant today as they were when they came from the precious lips of Jesus Christ,

Himself. Tucked away in this sermon is a statement that I have just never understood, but I believe the Holy Spirit has given me a little glimpse into what Jesus is trying to say. In verse 30, Jesus is speaking on adultery and He says, "And if your hand—even your stronger hand—causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell." (New Living Translation used here).

I always thought this text was interesting. In many other translations outside of the NLT you will read instead of "even your stronger hand", something like, "If your right hand causes you to sin." So, the NLT gives us a broader definition of "stronger hand", for our left-handed brothers and sisters. We have to ask ourselves though, why would it be better for me to be without one hand? Also, haven't we all sinned with both of our hands and both of our eyes? Shouldn't all of us Christians be known as folks that stumble around with no eyes, and no hands?

Here is what I think is one of the points that the text, and ultimately Jesus, is getting at. If you are to look at the time you wake up until the time you go to bed, your "strong hand" is what helps you get through a majority of your day. You pour your morning beverage with your stronger hand, you open your door and lock your door with your stronger hand. You shake or fist bump with your stronger hand. You cut your vegetables with your stronger hand, you eat those vegetables with your stronger hand. You get the point. If you were to take a look at all of the things that you do on a daily basis, you rely on your dominant hand. As an example, right now as I type I am only using my right thumb to hit the space bar between every sentence. This sentence I only used my left hand to hit the space bar, and it is taking me significantly longer to write it.

"Your right (or stronger hand) is one of the best things you have, but Jesus says that if it hinders you in following His precepts, then "cut it off". The principle taught here is the strictest discipline or less that ever hit humankind." (Oswald Chambers, <a href="www.utmost.org">www.utmost.org</a>) So, what is hindering you from following Jesus? Here is what I know in my

limited time in being a Christian. The very thing that you are the strongest at in this life is where you may be the weakest in your walk with Jesus. Not just your walk, but including Him into it. Where you are strongest, maybe work, or relationships for the extroverts, or reading and retaining a lot of information, is the place that you invite God into the least. Why? Because you have this. ou don't need His help here because you are more than proficient.

Here is a great example. know someone who, because of some trauma in their lives, does not sleep very well. It is incredibly difficult for them to go, and stay asleep every night. They pray every night to help them sleep and when they wake up in the middle of the night they ask God for help. I have never had this problem, except for about a week of my life. I always sleep, and 90% of the time I sleep well. This strength for me is not something I bring Jesus Christ into. he only time I am grateful for my sleep is when I talk to this other person who struggles so much with it.

Don't let your strengths in this life go by without bringing them to Jesus as well. There are many things in this life we are all gifted with and if those things are getting in the way of our walk with God, "it is better to be injured and lovely in God's sight, than to appear lovely to man's eyes but lame to God's." (Oswald Chambers).

My challenge for you this week is to find three things that on a daily basis you do not bring God into because you are proficient at it. Thank Him for these gifts and ask Him how you can use these gifts to glorify Him.
